- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 (A) A PERSON MAY NOT COMMIT THE COMMON LAW CRIME OF INDECENT 18 EXPOSURE.

19(B)A PERSON MAY NOT COMMIT THE COMMON LAW CRIME OF INDECENT20EXPOSURE WITHIN THE SIGHT OF A MINOR WHO IS AT LEAST 2 YEARS OLD.

(C) (1) A person [convicted of indecent exposure] WHO VIOLATES
 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION is guilty of a misdemeanor and ON CONVICTION is
 subject to imprisonment not exceeding 3 years or a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or both.

1 (2) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION IS 2 GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT 3 NOT EXCEEDING 5 YEARS OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$10,000 OR BOTH.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2020.
