### HOUSE BILL 918

(1) a felony;

2 (2) a misdemeanor or offense punishable by confinement [for more than 3 3 months or a fine of more than \$500];

4 (3) a delinquent act that would be a serious offense if committed by an 5 adult; or

6 (4) an offense in which, in the opinion of the court, the complexity of the 7 matter or the youth, inexperience, or mental capacity of the accused requires 8 representation of the accused by an attorney.

10 (b) (1) Indigent defendants or parties shall be provided representation under 11 this title in:

(i) a criminal or juvenile proceeding in which a defendant or partyis alleged to have committed a serious offense;
