- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 15 Article Criminal Law
- 16 **7–106.1.**

17 (A) A PERSON MAY NOT KNOWINGLY OR WILLFULLY OBTAIN OR EXERT 18 CONTROL THAT IS UNAUTHORIZED OVER A PACKAGE DELIVERED TO ANOTHER WITH 19 THE INTENT TO DEPRIVE THE OWNER OF THE PACKAGE.

(B) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A FELONY AND
 ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 5 YEARS OR A FINE
 NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 OR BOTH.



1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 October 1, 2020.
