1 AN ACT concerning

Drugged Driving – Controlled Dangerous Substance Testing – Authorized Police Officers

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing a police officer who has successfully completed a certain $\mathbf{5}$ program of training in advanced roadside impaired driving enforcement to request, 6 require, or direct that a person take a certain test for drug or controlled dangerous 7 substance content under certain circumstances; repealing a provision of law 8 authorizing a police officer who is a trainee, or is participating directly or indirectly 9 in a certain program of training, for certification as a drug recognition expert to request, require, or direct that a person take a certain test for drug or controlled 10 11 dangerous substance content under certain circumstances; making certain 12conforming changes; and generally relating to testing for drugged driving.
