## 1 CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE.

- 2 (b) (1) A person who violates [the provisions] SUBSECTION (A)(1) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$2,500 or imprisonment not exceeding 3 years or both.
